GENEOLOGICAL . . . PETER PAMPEL

Jewel Preuss Fox of Austin, supplied us with the following information about PETER PAMPEL. "Peter Prompel married a woman by the name of Betty (last name not given). He had two daughters: 1. Ella married an Osborne, 2. Esther married a Reed. Ella had a daughter named Nettie Lee. Peter was a half brother of Christina Pampel Preuss (Mrs. George Preuss). When Peter had a store in Serbin she worked for him until she married George Preuss. Peter later moved to Crawford, Texas where he had another store. He died there and is buried in Crawford, Texas. His mother is buried in Serbin. His daughter Ester lived in Silchy, Texas at one time."

Jewol writes; "I got this information from Mrs. Sam Heyset in Austin. She is the youngest daughter of Christina P AMPEL PREUSS. She is the only living child of Christina. She is 84 years old.

WENDS IL, WILLAFRICA....

Aboard a Pan Am Jumbo Jet, high above Scotland on our 1982 trip to Wendenland, a woman who boarded the same plane at New York, pointed to my "KISS ME I'M WINDISH" button and asked, "Are you "Wendish?"That started our conversation.

The lady was Mrs. Charlotte Parker from South A(rica. She told me of Wendlish settlers in and around King Williams Town, South Africa. There were about seventeen Wendish families, she said, and among them was a KASH-ULA NOAK SCHEMEL, who, at the age of 80, before she died, sang and recorded Wendish Folk Songs. Mrs. Parker said documents about the Wends and accounts of the Mendish settlers are in the KAFFRARIAN MUSEUM at King Williams Town, 5600, where Mrs. Randles is the Historian. (Probably some Noak folks may have some information about the Noacks in South Africa.) I hope to get some information from the Museum in King John J., Socha dilliams Town.
