ZWAHR FAMILY REUNION

On Sunday, June 10, the 14th annual KARL ERNST ZWAHR, Sr. Family Reunior was held at the American Legion Hall, Needville, Jexas, with 312 f amily members present at the noon meal, more arriving later for the afternoon activities. (Descendants of a brother, Georg Adolph Zwahr, hold an annual reunion each July at Burton, Tx.) The families of a Zwahr son and daughter, KARL EFNST ZWAHR Jr. and MARTHA ZWAHR MILLER, were in charge of the arrangements.

A casette recording in Wendish of "The Lord's Prayer" and "My Country 'Tis of Thee" was played prior to the noonday meal, followed by the playing of Wendish music from the Lausitz during the meal. For the afternoon entertrinment, music in English, German and Czech, for listening and dancing, was provided by "The Boehnemann Country Crossroads" band,

Prior to the afternoon business meeting conducted by E. A. REEH, special recognition was given to two surviving Zwahr children in attendance, ANNIE KRA-MER and SOPHIE MC DOUGAL. The other two surviving children, BETTIE WRUCK and ELIZABETH MILLER, were unable to be present because of illness. A total of 62 gifts, most handmade, were given as door prizes, with Susan B. Anthony silver dollars presented to all babies present who had been born since the previous June. AGNES (SCHOEBEL) DEMANETT of Hamilton City, Calif., won the prize for traveling the longest distance. Additional prizes were given to the oldest male present, ALPHONS SERVIERE; oldest female, HILDA (CESINGER) CLARK; couple married longest, HENRY AND OLIVIA (MILLER) TIELKE; couple married the shortest time, DALE AND PAMELA (TRIGGS) STRINGER.

The families of two Zwahr sons, OTTO ZWAHR and FRIEDRICH "Fritz" ZWAHR, will be in charge of the 1985 reunion, which will be held at Needville on the second Sunday in June.

KARL ERNST ZWAHR, Sr., patriarch of the family, was born in 1857 in Binn?witz bei Grosspostwitz, and died in 1942 at Needville, Tx. He arrived in Texas in 1882.
