- Rev. Hartfield gave the devotion and the members sang a hymnin German.
- Laverne Gersch thanked Rev. Hartfield and introduced the program.
- 5. Rev. Hartfield gave a talk on the meaning of heritage.
- Rev. Hartfield recognized Rev. and Mrs. Robert Boyce's 25th 6. anniversary and the 80th birthday of Lillian (Wieder) Oltmann. Ken Weiser showed us the ribbons that the Ben Nevis float received at the McDade Watermelon Festival, and the banner which the TWHS received at the August Folk Life Festival. Ron Knippa said that the Folk Festival will continue and that the TWHS should provide more Wendish crafts (aprons, bonnets, etc.). Carolyn Bohot suggested that we have a craftmaking session once a month. Someone suggested quiltmaking. The Wends of Texas by Anne Blasig. One of the earliest books on the Wends, written in 1952 by the daughter of Pastor Hermann Schmidt of Serbin. Hardcover. 123 pages. \$9.00

Texas Wends Their First Half-Century by Lillie Moerbe Caldwell. Story of the Wends, written in 1961. It includes many stories about the lives of some of the Wends who lived in Serbin in the 1800's. Hardcover. 283 pages. \$14.36 including tax.

Wendish Texans by Dr. Sylvia Ann Grider. Written in 1982, this book presents a concise overview of the Wends-life in Texas and former life in Europe. Hardcover. 120 pages. \$9.61 including tax.

Pastor John Kilian's Baptismal Records of St. Paul Lutheran Church, Serbin, Texas 1854-1883 translated by Dr. Joseph Wilson. Includes baptismal records of children Pastor Kilian baptised at Serbin, New Ulm, Swiss Alp and other communities. Records indicate occupations and residences of parents and baptismal sponsors. Hardcover. 359 pages. \$16.01 including tax.

As I Remember by Dora Weiser Fischer. Memories of growing up in Fedor in the early 1900's, includes stories on church, homemaking, language, farming, school and others. Hardcover. 178 pages. \$11.95 including tax.

Wendish Cookbook. First edition (1975). A quote from the book: "And in these recipes North European food style is adapted to use the foods of Texas, a new South Climate homeland." Softcover. 126 pages. \$10.00. While supply lasts.

Wendish Cookbook. Second edition (1988). A quote from the book: "Wherever the Wends have gone they have taken their love of fine food and their ability in preparing it. The pages of this book contain many of the recipes which Wendish women have passed down for generations, along with many other Texas favorites." Softcover. 134 pages. \$6.95.

The Lost Kitten by J. A. Rickard and Clyde Inez Martin. Children's book about two children who learn about the Wendish heritage. Softcover. 9 pages. \$1.00.

Confessional Lutheran Migration to America 150th Anniversary. The book covers the early history of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod. Softcover. 105 pages. \$10.68 including tax.

Pause to Ponder by Pastor Robert Koenig. History of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod in Texas, written in 1980. Softcover. 276 pages. \$10.62 suggested donation.

The Art of Decorating Wendish Easter Eggs by Daphne Dalton Garrett. The book is a "How To" book explaining and illustrating the art of decorating Easter eggs in the old Wendish custom. Softcover. 32 pages. \$5.28 including tax.

History of Fayette County by F. Lotto. Written by a son of Fayette County in 1902. The county seat of Fayette County is La Grange. Hardcover. 424 pages. \$16.01 including tax.

135th Anniversary Book of St. Paul Lutheran Church, Serbin. Printed in 1989, this book was written by the pastors of St. Paul. Softcover. 35 pages. \$4.26 including tax.

Lee County, Texas Cemeteries. Details information on cemetery markers in northern Lee County (North of Highway 21), including Lexington, Lincoln, Fedor, Manheim, and others. Softcover. 255 pages. Vol. I \$21.35 including tax.

Lee County, Texas Cemeteries. Details information on cemetery markers in southern Lee County (South of Highway 21), including Giddings City, St. Paul's Serbin & Dime Box. Vol. II \$26.69 including tax.

In Search of a Home. Nineteenth-Century Wendish Immigration by George R. Nielsen. Written in 1977 and revised in 1989, this book tells the histories of the Wends who migrated to Texas, Australia, Canada, Nebraska, and South Africa. The appendix includes a list of Wendish immigrants. Hardcover. 213 pages. \$12.00 including tax.

Christmas in Texas by Elizabeth Silverthorne. This book is ideal for giving. It will interest those interested in Texas history, those who want to reminisce about the old ways, and those who want to learn more about their heritage and the holidays.

The Wendish-Texan coloring book by Daphne Dalton Garrett. An educational coloring book for all ages. A historical explanation is given for each of the 25 pictures. Softcover. 28 pages. \$3.74 including tax.
