The flag raising ceremony by the American Legion York Post 276 was very impressive. First the Amerian flag was raised, then the Texas flag was raised, and then the Wendish flag was raised. After the pledge of allegiance, led by the Post members, Doris Reagan, the donor of this wonderful gift gave us a brief history of the Biehle and Tschatschula families. The flags and flagpoles were dedicated in memory of Mrs. Reagan's father, Karl Biehle. The group sang America first in English and the in Wendish.

The business meeting was called to order by Ken Weiser. A special welcome was given to Linda Boerger, who attended her first meeting, and to the visitors, Adele Sander, Martha Toll, and Peter Langer, a young Wendish man from the Bautzen area who has been visiting with the Wiederholds since September. He will present the program at our February meeting.

Copies of these will be kept in the archives. He also brought some pictures of the Wendish Fest which were put on display for the meeting.

Marian Wiederhold reported on the parlor furniture and Victorla received from Mrs. Frances Mitchell. These items belonged to the Mitschke and Wagner families. The nativity scene from Mrs. Mitchell was purchased in 1929 and Georgie Boyce has it on display in the Library.

Mrs. Boyce told of a children's book written by Duane Bamsch which is now for sale in the Gift Shop for \$3.50.

Reinhold Teinert announced that they will again be putting up a Christmas tree at North Cross Mall.

Leroy Steglich reported that our financial condition is much better than it was the last couple of years. A year ending report will be given in February.

Laverne Gersch informed the group that the Vogelhochzeit this year will consist of a noon meal and program at the sons of Hermann Hall on Sunday, January 23rd.

The outgoing officers were given a round of applause for a job well done.

Telford Zoch was thanked for putting up our Christmas Tree and Georgie Boyce, Evelyn Kasper and Barbara Hielscher for decorating the tree and buildings. After adjournment of the meeting the group enjoyed singing Christmas carols around the tree, accompanied by Jack Wiederhold on the accordian. A special treat was Silent Night in Wendish by Peter Langer.
