Memberships, visitors (Texas, out-of-state, and international) group tours, memorials, matching fund gifts, book and craft sales, noodle sales, booth participation at other area events, Museum display additions, all increased last year. We shared our heritage with extensive newspaper, magazine, and television coverage.

We especially thank sainted Agnes Lehmann for remembering the Texas Wendish Heritage Society in her will. So far the estate (Emily Putnam, executrix) has donated \$4,790.70 to the Society. It is gifts such as this that help build up the Endowment Fund

One of the long range goals of our organization is to build up this fund, whereby the interest earned by the fund will cover costs of maintaining the Museum.

140th Anniversary tributes are coming in very well. This is the third year that the Austin Chapter has decorated a Christmas Tree according to our Wendish Heritage. It was one of fourteen trees decorated by different ethnic groups in the Austin area.

Decorations were consistant with what was remembered from our Christian heritage as the Wends settled in the Serbin area of Texas. Bags set under the tree remind us of the children receiving goodie-bags after the Christmas Eve Service in Church. Other decorations on the tree consisted of cookies, apples, small bags. filled with nuts and candy, crocheted snow flakes, candles, and decorated antique Christian Christmas Cards. Some of the cards

were pictures of the manger scene in Bethlehem. On the top of the tree was a crocheted angel in white depicting the message to the shepherds that Christ was born.

Many compliments were received from people who saw the tree, giving special comments about the crocheted baskets and snow flakes.

The tree remained in place from November 21st to December 28th. Irene and Reinhold Teinert decorated the tree. They were assisted by their son Nelson and his two children Cara and Nelson Jr.

These trees were set up in North Cross Mall which is located South West of the intersection of Burnet Road and Anderson Lane. Plans are in place to have this Christmas Tree display again in 1994.
