## AUSTIN ETHNIC FAIR By Jan Slack and Della Mullens, Co-Chairpersons

The Second Annual Austin Ethnic Fair was held January 24, 1998, at the Woltman Activities Center on the campus of Concordia University at Austin. The Ethnic Fair, sponsored by the University's Wendish Council, is a celebration of Austin's rich ethnic diversity, and is scheduled on the Saturday closest to January 25 in observance of Ptaci Kwas or the Birds' Wedding, an annual Wendish Holiday.

David Goeke led the show as the Master of Ceremony, and gave better than his best in his role of performance announcer, door prize number caller, and crowd energizer. Various cultural groups performed throughout the day including the Lee County German Singers, Austin Scottish Country Dancers, Fayette Czech Heritage Singers, Puerto Rican Cultural Alliance, Austin Saengerrunde, David Chapel Baptist Church Male Chorus, Alsatian Dancers of Texas, Tomonokai Friendship Group, Trio Los Castro, Puerto Rican Folkloric Dancers, and the Austin Chinese School. Also offered at various times during the day were Dr. Charles Wukasch and Rev. Elmer Hohle telling Wendish folktales and singing Wendish hymns and songs, and the Austin Gaelic League giving introductory lessons to the Irish language and Irish story-telling. Representatives from various ethnic groups including Swedish, Irish, Greek, Italian, Japanese, French, Puerto Rican, German, Czech, Scottish, English, and Polish displayed, demonstrated, and sold various folk arts, artifacts and ethnic foods. And, of course, our Wendish booths included sales of books, arts and crafts, and fabulous food including smoked sausage and chicken legs, sauerkraut, noodles, and coffee cake, and demonstrations of egg decorating and noodle-making. Many wonderful door prizes were donated for the event and were given throughout the day. Closing the celebration was a Bird's Wedding skit performed by children from Hope Lutheran Church, the Austin Children's Choir, and the Rev. Carl Trovall, Campus Minister of Concordia University at Austin.

Special mention should be made of a number of people who gave freely of their personal time and resources in planning and executing the event, including Evelyn and Allan Buchhorn, Ruby and Thomas Sisco, Kenda Zawadyki, Ken Weiser, Rev. Robert and Georgie Boyce, Barbara Hielscher, Walter and Laverne Gersch, Charles Slack, Monroe Karcher, Ted Zoch, Rev. # WENDISH LETTER PROJECT

The project is a cooperative effort supported by The Serbski Institute in Bautzen and by the Wendish societies in Australia and Texas. The purposes are (1) to locate correspondence written by Wendish immigrants before more letters are lost, (2) to transcribe/translate these documents so they can be more widely used, and (3) to make them available inexpensively for use now and in the future.

At the end of 1997 approximately 200 letters have been located in newspapers, archives, and personal possessions. Approximately 137 originated from Australia and 63 from the United States. They were written either in Wendish or in German.

The Sorbian institute is supporting the project by translating those documents written in Wendish into German. The primary task for the Texans and Australians is to transcribe the letters from the old German script into the Latin script and then to translate them into English. Not only are people with the skill to read the script rare, but the difficulty of deciphering the handwriting makes the task time-consuming. Funds contributed to the project will be used largely to compensate the transcribers and translators, and the expectation is that these will be token payments rather than adequate compensation. Because the material will be circulated on electric media there should be limited publication costs.

No terminal date has been set for the project, and the hope is that more letters will be located as time goes on.

Dr. George R. Nielsen, author of In Search of a Home: Nineteenth-Century Wendish Migration is the coordinator of the project.

## TEXAS WENDISH HERITAGE SOCIETY GENERAL MEETING Nov. 16, 1997

President, Georgie Boyce, called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. in the Kilian Building of the museum complex at Serbin, Texas, on Sunday, November 16, 1997.

Rev. Robert Boyce based the opening devotion on Hebrews 12: 1 & 2. He said that the Texas Wendish Heritage Society is a cloud of witness for Jesus to others.

35 members and one visitor, Mary Glenn Thomas, were present.

The August 17th minutes were approved as mailed to the membership.

George Boerger's financial report covered the Wendish Fest proceeds and showed a very good increase in profits from last year, partly due to the raise in price of tickets, donations and craft sales. A full report will be presented at the February meeting with the proposed budget for 1998.

Elinor Steglich reported that 2900 lbs. of noodles have been made in 1997, and plans are to make noodles several times this year yet.

Georgie Boyce announced that the Walk-In Coffee was cancelled because of an error in booking by the Giddings Chamber of Commerce This was to have been held in October. Plans now are to have it in February, 1998.

Members were asked to bring donations for the bake sale to be held at the La Grange State Bank on December 12th. Evelyn Kasper asked members to bring items to the museum on Thursday, December 1 if that would be more convenient.

Della Mullens, Jan and Charles Slack, Chairpersons of the Concordia Ethnic Fair on January 24th, gave a report and asked for help. There are 19 ethnic groups represented at Concordia. Flyers were given to those wishing to help publicize this event.

Georgie Boyce announced that her sister, Margie Loomans, had donated \$500 for the Fax Machine.

She reminded members to do some Christmas shopping in the Gift Shop. Gertrude Mahlings book is sold out in Germany. We still have it available in German and Wendish.

Vivian Taylor, George Boerger and Freddie Zoch served on the ballot committee. Officers elected were Georgie Boyce, President, Elinor Schulze, Vice= President, Jan Slack, Secretary and Laverne Gersch, Treasurer.

A motion passed to destroy the ballots after the election.

Georgie thanked Telford Zoch for cutting the Christmas tree and red berries and Evelyn Kasper for helping decorate the tree

The meeting adjourned and the group enjoyed singing German Christmas carols led by Jack Wiederhold. Holiday treats brough by several members were enjoyed by all.
