President's Message

The month of March 1999 brought a very wonderful experience for me when I was blessed with a trip to Germany, in the company of my daughter, Lisa Jones, and grand daughter, Ketrin Jones, of Abilene, Texas, and my niece, Jenny Sharrock Pecore, of Houston, Texas. It was a marvelous experience for three generations of Wends to fly to Dresden, rent an automobile, and drive to Bautzen. There we had lodging at <u>Pension Dom-Eck</u>, which is near the <u>Dom St. Petri</u> in the historic section of the city, and yet offers all modern conveniences. The <u>Dom-Eck</u> and the Sorbische restaurant, <u>Wjelbik</u> which serves a delicious Hochzeit meal, are owned by Stefan and Veronika Mahling, brother-in-law and sister-in-law of authorcss, Gertrud Mahling, who graciously functioned as our translator for two busy afternoons.

We had the opportunity to enjoy the hospitality of the *Domowina*, where we were greeted by Jurji Wuschansky with wonderful refreshments, and gifts for the Museum. I was also honored to meet with President Jakob Brankatschk to discuss TWHS affiliation, (non-voting membership), with the *Domowina*, as well as some of our common goals and ambitions regarding our history and culture. Afterward, we made purchases for TWHS gift shop at the Domowina bookstore.

We were also able to visit Sorbisches Institut e.V., where I met with Annerose Schaffrath, Technical Director of the Sorbische Central Library, and delivered copies of back issues of our TWHS newsletter. We discussed their interest in the Wendish language (Lutheran) Agenda, translated in 1883, by Jan Kilian. She also asked that I encourage the use of their library for research concerning the Sorbs, but asked that I stress that this is not a genealogical library.

Other highlights in Bautzen included visiting the Sorbisches Museum and director, Tomasz Nawka. We enjoyed demonstrations of decorating Wendish Easter eggs at the Sorbisches Culture Center, and Ketrin got to try her hand at decorating an egg. Several evenings where spent with Michaela Delenk, who was one of my houseguests during the visit of Volkstanzgruppe-Schmerlitz at our 1998 Wendish Fest. On Friday evening we attended the Deutsch-Sorbisches Volkstheater. Michaela is now working in Bautzen for the Sorbisches National Ensemble in public relations.

On a personal note, the girls and I visited the many towns and villages, to the east and northeast of Bautzen, which were homes to our ancestors. In <u>Spreewitz</u>, <u>Suzanne Hornich</u> showed us the restoration work that has been done on the church, but is incomplete due to lack of funds. Schleife has a neat Sorbisches Culture Center with many homemade Sorbisches items for sale, and also a restaurant featuring Sorbische food. <u>Hoyerswerda</u> information center had many beautifully decorated Easter eggs for us to buy. In Baruth, Gertrud took us to meet ceramic artist, Eva U. Lange, at her home.

Upon returning to Dresden, Peter Langer (who brought the Sorbisches group to our 1996 Fest) and his friend, Heika Neubert, were kind enough to guide us to some of the cultural and historical sights in Dresden, including dining in the 15th Century atmosphere of *Anno Domini Restaurant*.

Thank you Lisa, Jenny, and Ketrin for a wonderful and memorable trip!

Third Annual Austin Ethnic Fair January 23, 1999

The third annual Austin Ethnic Fair was held January 23, 1999 at the Woltman Activities Center on the Campus of Concordia University at Austin. The Ethnic Fair, sponsored by the University's Wendish Council, is a celebration of Austin's rich ethnic diversity, and is scheduled on the Saturday closest to January 25 in observance of Ptaci Kwas or the Birds' Wedding, an annual Wendish holiday.

David Goeke shared emcee duties this year with Olga Campos, Austin's KVUE Channel 24 anchor. Various cultural groups performed throughout the day including the Austin Scottish Country Dancers, Austin Saengerrunde Men's and Women's Chorus, Round Rock High School Ballet Folklorico, Philippine Art and Performing Group, Taylor Czech Singers, Austin Chinese School, Okinawan Dancers, Puerto Rican Folkloric Dance, and KINESIS Dance Theatre Project. Representatives from various ethnic groups including Polish, Japanese, Italian, Czech, Greek, German, Cuban, Mexican, Swedish, Puerto Rican, and Scottish displayed, demonstrated, and sold various folk arts, artifacts and ethnic foods. And, of course, our Wendish booths included sales of books and arts and crafts, demonstrations of egg decorating and noodle-making, and food including smoked sausage and chicken legs, sauerkraut, noodles, and coffee cake. A silent auction was held throughout the day offering many wonderful items donated by Austin area businesses and by some of the groups participating in the Fair, including the Texas Wendish Heritage Society.

We wish to thank all the hard-working committee members organizing this event and the Wendish booths including Dr. David Zersen (President of Concordia-Austin), Laura Arldt (Concordia's Director of Events), Evelyn and Alan Buchhorn, Monroe Karcher, Ted Zoch, Rev. Among Our Members and Friends

Daphne Garrett reports that her latest publication, **Giddings Deutsches Volksblatt**, **1899-1949**; a History of the Newspaper and Print shop of the Texas Wends has drawn a lot of attention from universities which have a Slavic studies department, thanks to our member **David Chroust**. David is Monographs Cataloger at Texas A&M University's Evans Library. He belongs to a Slavic librarians' chat group on the Internet, and posted a notice about the book. She has received orders from the libraries of Harvard, Stanford, Duke, Texas A&M, Univ. of Cincinnati, Toronto, Ohio, Michigan, Texas, Texas A&M and many others; also from public libraries including Dallas, and New York City Public Library which ordered two copies. The Sorbische Institut in Bautzen is also very interested, especially because the book describes Daphne's discovery of an unknown Wendish language *Agenda* written by Pastor John Kilian in 1883 and printed, but not published, by John Proske in 1909. The book can be ordered from the Gift Shop of the Wendish Museum and from Garrett Historical Research at P.O. Box 35, Warda, Texas, 78960.

Joseph (Joe) Wilson is now retired from the Department of German and Slavic Languages at Rice University He now holds the title of Professor Emeritus and maintains an office in the main Library. He looks forward to having more time to work on his many Wendish related projects.

From the lists of Australian Wendish family names which Olga Radke left with you, many of our group could readily trace some Wendish ancestry in their family."

"We had an excellent holiday throughout the USA. We were very fortunate with weather conditions throughout that time and we all returned home safely."

"We had an informal meal and fellowship evening of our tour group in January to share experiences, photos, memorabilia, etc, of that holiday. Many are still talking about the day we spent with you and the evening meal we had at Louis Biar's property at Serbin."

The letter goes on with a sad note telling us that their son, Andrew (19), who was with them on the tour, lost his life in a road accident on January 22nd. We extend sympathy to the family.

Should any members wish to tour in Australia Mr. Saegenschnitter would be prepared to assist in co-ordinating the itinerary for such tour including places of Wendish heritage there.

Texas Wendish Heritage Society General Meeting February 21, 1999

President Georgie Boyce called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. in the Kilian Building of the museum complex at Serbin, Texas, on Sunday, February 21, 1999.

Reverend Michael Buchhorn of St. Paul Lutheran Church, Serbin, led the group in singing two hymns about journeys, "Let Us Ever Walk with Jesus" and "Jesus, Lead Thou On." We were reminded of our ancestors' journey to Texas and their ultimate journey to their heavenly home. This ultimate journey is one we all take, the price of which was paid for by God living among us in the worst of circumstances and dying on the cross willingly so we would have passage to our heavenly home.

Forty-two members were present. Also attending the meeting as visitors were Marie Richards, Betty Smith, Pearl Heckmann, Al and Carolyn Jurk, and Lisa Stapp.

The minutes of the November 15, 1998 General Meeting were approved as presented.

George Boerger presented the 1998 Actual and 1999 Projected financial report, stating that 1998 was a strong year for the Texas Wendish Heritage Society. The Society closed the year with \$3,138 in surplus even with the unexpected expenses involved with the Museum burglary and advertising for the Wendish Fest. The 1999 projected budget includes an increase in expenses to cover purchase of a new copy machine and hiring an additional employee, a part-time Museum director, during mid-year. It was suggested that the Board should order an occasional audit of the financial records, and this idea will be brought to the Board for consideration at the April 1999 meeting. Motion was approved to accept the Financial Report as presented.

Hattie Schautschick, Noodle Committee Chairperson, reported that the Committee members produced 4,139 pounds of noodles during 1998. Thus far for 1999, 520 pounds have been produced.

Evelyn Kasper thanked everyone for donating money or baked goods for the Hielscher bake sale held November 20, 1998 in La Grange. Cash donated totaled \$275, sales totaled \$590.51, and the Serbin AAL Branch donated matching funds of \$500 for a total of \$1,365.51 presented to Carroll and Barbara Hielscher to help offset expenses incurred during Carroll's recent cancer surgery and ongoing treatment. Carroll is now undergoing chemotherapy and we are all asked to keep Carroll and Barbara in our prayers.

Jan Slack reported on the Austin Ethnic Fair, which was held January 23, 1999 in the Woltman Activities Center on the Concordia University campus. Austin's Channel 36 Saturday morning news gave good coverage of the event during their broadcast. Everyone was thanked for helping with this fun event, which was deemed a success, overall, and will be held again on January 22, 2000. Georgie Boyce announced that extra sausage is still available for sale at a cost of 2 links for \$4.00.

Hattie Schautschick gave a report on the Walk-in Coffee, which was held February 9, 1999. Sales and donations for the day totaled \$675.00. Special thanks were given to Eunice Dunk and everyone who donated their time or personal funds. For those desiring to contribute to this effort, cash donations are still being accepted.

Georgie Boyce reported that the billboard project is gaining momentum. The grant money has been spent and four locations have been chosen for the signs. Bluebonnet Electric will provide the

labor and materials to set the poles. Ken Weiser was thanked for his work and guidance with this project.

Georgie Boyce reminded everyone present that docents are needed to work Saturdays and Sundays. If possible, volunteers are requested to choose a specific Saturday or Sunday each month to work, and to be responsible for finding a substitute if they cannot work their chosen day.

New business:

- (1) Museum Director. The Board is considering the idea of hiring a part-time Museum director. If anyone has suggestions or comments on this, please give them to Georgie Boyce for consideration at the April 1999 meeting.
- (2) A new temporary exhibit in the Museum displays artifacts, pictures and information about area businesses. A permanent display on the Giddings Deutsches Volksblatt has been prepared.
- (3) Several letters have been received from Rachel Hildebrandt seeking information on the Texas Wends for a project. Specifically, she would like personal stories about Johann Kilian. If anyone has memories of stories told to them by their elders about Reverend Kilian, please send them to the Museum.
- (4) It was noted that the Giddings Courthouse Centennial will be in May 1999. Georgie Boyce will inquire about the Texas Wendish Heritage Society's possible participation in this event.

A motion was made and approved to adjourn the meeting at 2:45 PM with thanks given to those providing refreshments. Georgie Boyce then presented the video entitled "A Visit to the Lusatian Sorbs," which was filmed in the Wendish areas of Germany.
